LEWISVILLE HISTORICAL SITES



Lewisville Roller Mill

- **Lewisville Roller Mill** The mill was built in 1910 by J.P. Sprinkle family and then sold in 1925 to Fielden and Ollie Jennings, who operated it for 58 years. It was the active center of Lewisville for many years. Customers came from miles around to purchase flour, corn meal, animal feed, fertilizer, garden and farm products. After the town was incorporated in 1991, the mill was made a part of the town logo. It currently houses several shops and offices. 6275 Shallowford Road.
- **Lewis Laugenour House** This is the home of founder of Lewisville. 6495 Shallowford Rd, beside Shallowford Square. <http://lewisvillehistory.org/stories-the-story-of-lewis-case-laugenour-and-his-home/>
- **George Elias Nissen House** This classic 19th century home has been restored and updated. George Elias was the head of the Nissen Wagon Works from 1874-1913, located in the Waughtown district of Winston Salem. The Nissen House is a venue for special events, meetings, and small weddings. 213 Arrow Leaf Dr. For more information call (336)946-6504 or visit the website www.nissenhouse.org

- **Finch-Kimel House:** Early 1900s. Notable occupants included Talmadge Kimel and M. C. Benton, a former mayor of Winston-Salem. It is used as a horse farm. 8254 Concord Church Road. Private.

- **Concord United Methodist Church** Founded in 1809, this is the oldest Methodist congregation in Forsyth County. 8955 Concord Church Rd.
- **Brookstown United Methodist Church** This church was established in 1852. The church log structure was completed in 1855 and replaced in 1937. 6274 Yadkinville Rd, Pfafftown 27040. <http://brookstown.umcchurches.org/>
- **Great Philadelphia Wagon Road Marker** This was the primary frontier road during the 18th and 19th century, running from Pennsylvania to Georgia. The trade and settlement route ran through the heart of Lewisville, running in from Lewisville-Vienna Road through Shallowford Square and out Shallowford Road. There is a marker located in Shallowford Square.

- **The Nissen Wagon Museum** This is an example of an authentic Conestoga-style wagon built by Nissen Wagon Company. Located on the Great Wagon Road in Shallowford Square.
- **Shiloh Lutheran Church and cemetery** This is the oldest established church in Lewisville. 703 Lewisville-Vienna Rd. <https://www.shilohlutherannc.com/>
- **George Mock House** This restored home was built in 1870's by one of Lewisville's early residents. 5750 Shallowford Rd, Lewisville. Private.
- **Charles L. Spaugh House** This is the home of a noted Lewisville civic and religious leader and was built around 1900. 6735 Shallowford Rd. Private.
- **Vogler-Reynolds House** This is the late 19th-century homestead of James Vogler and long-time site of L.A. Reynolds Nursery, one of Forsyth County's first landscape businesses. 814 Reynolds Rd. Private.
- **Albert W. "Sid" Lawrence House, late 1800's:** This home was owned by Mary Alice Fulk Warren. It was demolished in 2020 and the land was donated to the town of Lewisville for the new Mary Alice Warren Community Center which opened in November 2021
- **Sears Roebuck House** This house was built in 1925 by Pinkney Evan Hauser, owner of a dairy, tobacco farm and sawmill. 6265 Yadkinville Road, Pfafftown, 27040. Private.

LEWISVILLE PARKS AND GARDENS

- **Shallowford Square, pictured on front cover** This Square was voted a Great Public Space in 2017 by the NC American Planning Association and offers free movies, plays and concerts. - **Jack Warren Park** This property was a gift to the town by Mary Alice Warren and contains a walking trail, exercise stations, perennial and wildflower gardens, children's playground, bocce area, picnic pavilion, deciduous azalea slope blooming in spring and early summer. LEWISVILLE POINTS OF INTEREST

- **Lewisville Veterans Memorial** This memorial recognizes veterans from multiple wars. Located in Shallowford Square at 6555 Shallowford Rd. <https://docsouth.unc.edu/commland/monument/267/>
- **Mary Alice Warren Community Center:** The new community center was completed in 2021 and is named the Mary Alice Warren Community Center after Lewisville resident Mary Alice Warren, who donated the 15-acre site on which the community center was built. The community center is located on Lewisville-Clemmons Road next to Jack Warren Park, a 15-acre multi-use park that opened in 2010, a site also donated to the Town by Mary Alice Warren. The 12,000 square foot center includes multi-purpose conference rooms, catering kitchen, an arts and crafts room and a large, covered patio for outdoor events. - **Frank Holder Metal Works Displays at the Mary Alice Warren Community Center** Frank Holder was a long-time resident of Lewisville. He created metal sculptures of animals, insects, flowers, mermaids, and other whimsical creations. A donor purchased three pieces of Holder's sculptures and donated them to the Town of Lewisville for display at the Community Center. Two Holder dinosaurs will be placed behind the Center in 2022. Opal the Ostrich has been on display at the entrance driveway since the Center opening in 2021.

- **Conrad Road scenic drive** This offers a lovely sugar maple route with stunning fall colors. The historic Conrad House is on the right and the historic River John House is on the left (private residences). Turn right off Shallowford Rd.

POINTS OF INTEREST NEAR LEWISVILLE

- **AME Zion Church Cemetery** This is a historic African-American cemetery. There are grave markers for all slaves who worked at Panther Creek Plantation from 1767-1865. Located at end of Double Springs Rd, just past 11695 Double Springs Rd.
- **Town of Bethania** This early Moravian settlement was founded in 1759. It has a Visitors Center, historic house tours, Bethania Mill and Graveyard Hill .7 mi walking trail. 5393 Ham Horton Lane, Bethania. <http://www.historicbethania.org/>
- **Bethania Mill** This is a historic mill used for some retail and offices spaces.
- **Town of Huntsville** This town was established in the 1790's by Charles Hunt. It is located on the Great Wagon Road. Shallowford Road. <https://www.huntersville.org>.
- **Old "White House" (Clingman-Sofley House), Huntsville** This was built in 1795, and is located on Shallowford Rd., about 1 block on right after you cross the Yadkin River bridge. - **Old Panther Creek Plantation** The original structure was the pre-revolutionary war home of the Colonel Joseph Williams family (house burned in 1885, replaced in 1907). This was one of Lewisville's most influential families. Hidden by trees in the summer. 11695 Double Springs Rd. Private.
- **Jones Country Store** This old-time country store was established in 1875 and run by three generations of the Joseph Spurgeon Jones family for a century. It is no longer in business. 8950 Shallowford Rd.
- **Griffith-Jones Old Home Place** This is a historic log cabin built in 1859 by William Asbury Jones, a Forsyth County Magistrate. 9950 Concord Church Rd. Private.
- **Old Salem Museum and Gardens, Winston-Salem** This Moravian settlement was established in 1766. The settlement includes a Moravian Church, God's Acre Cemetery, Old Salem Tavern, Winkler Bakery, several shops and tours. 900 Old Salem Rd, Winston-Salem. <http://www.oldsalem.org/>
- **Town of Bethabara, Winston Salem** This was founded in 1753 and is the oldest Moravian Settlement in Forsyth County. It offers a Visitor Center, guided tours, wildlife preserve and educational programs. 2147 Bethabara Rd, Winston-Salem. <https://historicbethabara.org/>

- **Reynolda House and Gardens, Winston-Salem** This is the former home of R.J. Reynolds, founder of the Reynolds Tobacco company. He and his wife Katherine were major philanthropists of Winston Salem. The house is now an American art museum, has gardens and

PARKS AND GARDENS NEAR LEWISVILLE

- **Tanglewood Park, Clemmons** This park has walking and off-road biking trails, arboretum and gardens, playground, swimming pool, lake boating, stocked lakes, horseback rides, dog park, golf course, BMX Track, RV facilities, historical cemetery, the Holiday Light Show and several event space rental options. 4201 Manor House Circle, Clemmons.

- **Vienna Village Assisted and Independent Living** This has been in business for more than 50 years. Lovely perennial gardens are located along the walking path around the main building. Barn quilts decorate the out-sheds. 6601 Yadkinville Rd, Pfafftown, 27040.

- **Jamison Park, Winston-Salem** This park is near the Muddy Creek Greenway and Meadowlark Middle School. It has a playground, picnic area and fenced dog play area. 285 Meadowlark Dr., Winston-Salem. <http://www.cityofws.org/Departments/Recreation-Parks/Rentals/Picnic-Shelters/Jamison-Park>
- **Iris gardens on Meadowlark** This was established by Thelma Boose. The 2-acre iris field is located next to the owner's home. The blooms peak in late spring and are for viewing and purchase. 902 Meadowlark Dr. Winston Salem. Pull into the driveway and there is a small area to park to the left of the house.
- **Muddy Creek Greenway, Winston-Salem** The Greenway can be accessed via several access points and includes 2.9 miles of paved walking, biking, dog walking and running trails. This is a good location for bird watchers and sighting of wild flowers in early Spring.

- **Shore Styers Mill Park, Yadkinville** Includes the Shacktown Falls. 1400 Styers Mill Road, Yadkinville, 27055. To get to the Shacktown Falls, go 421N to Old Stage Rd exit. Turn right at exit and go 1 block and take a left. Go about .4 miles and turn right onto Styers Mill Rd. Go .3 miles to the bridge over Deep Creek. LEWISVILLE SCENIC DRIVING LOOP

- I. **Starting at North St (between Shallowford Square and Laugenour House), turn right onto Shallowford Rd and go to first roundabout. Historic Spaugh House is on the right. Enter the roundabout and take first right out of roundabout (Shallowford Rd).**
- II. **At about .9 mile on Shallowford Rd, you'll pass Conrad Rd on right (scenic fall leaves drive).**
- III. **2.2 miles: You'll pass an historic tobacco barn on right with early horse-drawn buggy and U.S. flag on side.**
- IV. **4.0 miles: Historic Old Jones Grocery on left (not open for business).**

- V. **4.2 miles: Medaloni Wine Cellars on right.**
- VI. **About 4.7 miles: Turn left onto Williams Rd. NOTE: If you continue onto Shallowford Rd. instead of turning onto Williams Rd., you will pass the old “White House” and the Battle Branch Café on your left (about 2 miles from the Williams Rd. turn). Continuing further on Shallowford Rd. will take you to the historic town of Huntsville.**
- VII. **At about .2 mile on Williams Rd is West Bend Vineyards (on left and right).**
- VIII. **Follow Williams Rd for about 2.7 miles and watch for Double Spring Rd on left. On Double Spring, historic Panther Creek Plantation may be visible from the road (better view in winter). Historic AME Zion Church cemetery is at the end of Double Spring Rd. Return to Williams Rd.**
- IX. **Turn left onto Williams Rd. At about .5 mile is scenic 4T Stables and Horse Farm on right.**
- X. **Proceed to roundabout (about 3 miles) and take first right out of roundabout onto Concord Church Rd.**
- XI. **Go about 1 mile on Concord Church Rd, passing the historic Finch-Kimel home and horse farm on left. Turn left onto Dull Rd (historic log cabin area along left side of road).**

- XII. **Go to where Dull Rd ends at Styers Ferry Rd (about 1 mile) and turn left onto Styers Ferry Rd.**
- XIII. **Soon after turning onto Styers Ferry Rd, turn left on Lasley Road. The metal works artist, Frank Holder, was a longtime resident on Lasley Road. Be sure to notice the whimsical metal sculptures created by Frank Holder for his neighbors. You will see mailboxes fashioned into bugs and oversized flowers in yards. Continue on Lasley Road to see Joe's Landscaping and Nursery on right, with Joe's Old Time Country Store.**
- XIV. **At end of Lasley Rd, turn left onto Reynolds Rd, and watch for a barn on the left followed by the historic Vogler-Reynolds House.**
- XV. **Go to end of Reynolds Rd and turn left onto Lewisville-Clemmons Rd to return to downtown Lewisville. You'll pass Joanie Moser Park on your right and the Mary Alice Warren Community Center and Jack Warren Park on the left.**
- XVI. **When Lewisville-Clemmons Rd ends at the stop light in Lewisville, turn left on Shallowford Rd. The historic Laugenour House and Shallowford Square will be on your right, starting point for the scenic tour.**
