

Stormwater Reminder: Pet Waste Disposal

Keep Our Water Clean,
Pick Up Your Pet's Waste!

WHAT IS THE PROBLEM?

When it rains, dog waste runs into storm drains and then into lakes, streams and rivers. Dog waste contains roundworms, *E. coli*, and Giardia. These can cause nausea, vomiting, stomach cramps and more in humans. Excess nutrients found in dog waste cause algal blooms, which reduce oxygen in the water and can cause fish and other aquatic life to die.



WHAT CAN I DO?

- ◆ Bring a bag with you on your walks to pick up after your pet.
- ◆ Frequently clean the pet waste from your yard, deck, patio, driveway and sidewalk.
- ◆ Dispose of pet waste by throwing it in the trash, burying it in the backyard, or composting it.

There are about 404,480 dogs in the Piedmont Triad. These dogs make 133,478 pounds of dog waste, or 7 dump trucks full every DAY.



Each year 48 million pounds of raw sewage washes into our rivers, unless the dog owners pick up the waste.
