Bulky item collection events are held a few times per year and provide Lewisville residents an easy and convenient way to dispose of unwanted, large items that would otherwise need to be taken to the landfill. Town Hall has received recent calls about the event, so Town staff is anticipating high participation from Lewisville residents.

Monday, January 14
7:00 a.m.

Acceptable Items for bulk collection

Household furniture, lawn furniture, carpet, extra large rugs, bicycles, toilets, grills (no propane) mattresses and box springs (limit of 2 sets per household)

White Goods - Stoves, refrigerators, freezers (doors must be removed), water heaters, dishwashers

All items must be in plain view and may not be bagged or boxed.

Items must be placed within three feet of the curb

Items NOT Accepted

Televisions, computers, mirrors or glass of any kind, household waste, yard waste, dead animals, tires, hazardous waste, chemicals, paint, microwaves, electronic waste, car motors, clothing, shoes, books, general recycle items, liquid waste, batteries, motor oil and any equipment containing oil or gas. Lumber scraps, construction debris, bagged trash, cardboard and cardboard boxes

Lewisville Town Hall will be closed Tuesday, January 1 in observance of New Year's Day.

Waste Management will also be closed Tuesday, January 1. Trash pickup will be delayed one

day beginning Tuesday, January 1 through Friday, January 4.

Take Caution When Recycling to Stop Contamination

Have you ever heard the phrase, "one bad apple spoils the bunch?"

The same is true for recycling, where one non-recyclable item can spoil an entire batch of otherwise good materials. It may seem like such a small detail – a wrong item in the recycling bin – but it represents a global problem that's preventing thousands of tons of recyclables from ever seeing a second life.

"Thank you for being

dedicated recyclers!," said Chairperson of the Lewisville Recycling Committee Kay Smitherman.

"Here are a few reminders to prevent contamination in the recycling stream. Lewisville recycles ONLY narrow-necked plastic bottles and jars. And please, NO peanut butter, mayonnaise, or cooking oil containers. That goes



for pizza boxes, too. The oils are contaminants! Those items need to go in your trash."

The Town of Lewisville website has a full color page with pictures of accepted and NOT accepted items for bi-weekly pickup.

"Thank you for protecting our environment!," Smitherman said.

Did you know? If a load of recycling contains

non-recyclables – even by just a fraction – that entire load risks not being recycled. That's according to new guidelines being enforced by China, a major importer of recyclable materials created in the U.S. Why does it matter? Quite simply, if you're not recycling right you could be preventing tons and tons of materials from ever seeing a second life.

Holiday Cardboard Recycling Collection

The Recycling Committee will once again be sponsoring the Holiday Cardboard Recycling Collection.

This year's collection will run through Tuesday, January 2 in the Lewisville Elementary School Parking lot. This Recycling Event is for cardboard/chip board, such as gift boxes, shipping boxes or packaging from toys.

The bin will be emptied on a regular basis so that additional items can be recycled. If the bin is full and your items will not fit, please do not leave items in the parking lot or surrounding the bin.

Lewisville Elementary School allows the Recycling Committee to use the parking lot for this event as a service to Town residents, so please be mindful of this when recycling items.

Christmas Tree Removal

Another important holiday collection is this year's Christmas tree removal, which will begin on Monday, January 7.

Trees must be cleared of all lights and decorations and at curbside by 6 a.m. on that day to ensure pick up, and there will be only one pass through town to collect trees.
