The NC Department of Health and Human Services is asking people to remember these three things as we stay strong and continue to flatten the curve and slow the spread of COVID-19.


If you leave home, practice your Ws: Wear, Wait, Wash

# Roadways & Rights-of-Way Must Remain Clear for Safety

The Town Public Works Department requests the assistance of residents in ensuring that all streets and right-of-ways remain clear for traffic and emergency vehicles.

"Although we know items placed aren't with any mal intent, we have to keep all rights-of-way and roadways clear for all traffic to travel, including emergency vehicles that might need to use the right-of-way in an emergency situation," said Public Works Director Ryan Moser.

Items that are found in violation of Town Code 31-7 will be given a warning notice prior to removal.

Town Code 31-7 Streets Rights-of-way Management Program Section G: 4. Any generally immovable man-made object representing a direct hazard to motor vehicles accidently exiting the street and entering the unimproved area of the right-of-way.


