TOWN COUNCIL PLANNING WORKSHOP

The annual Town Council planning workshop took place Saturday, January 20 at Town Hall. "This workshop was largely an opportunity for the Council and staff to talk about projects and planning in the works and what we see on the horizon in the years to come. This year's workshop served as a session for Capital Project Planning. It helps the Council to focus on the Town's long range capital needs, rather than the regular day to day activities that Council focuses on during regular briefing sessions," noted Town Manager Hank Perkins.

As a town we continue to strive to make our Town a great place to live with continued improvements. With this comes proper planning and fiscal health. Over the next several years as we implement the Town's long range Capital Improvement and Infrastructure Plan, it will include projects of a new community center, transportation, new sidewalks and parks and recreation enhancements.

DULL ROAD REPAIRS

Based on information we have received from the NC Department of Transportation, Dull Road will be closed for a few weeks in both directions with a detour sometime around the beginning of March. The closure is a result of needed repair to replace the existing pipe culvert that runs under the width of Dull Road at Ellison Creek. Local traffic will still be able to access locations on either side of the culvert up to the point of closure at the culvert construction area. Please follow detour signs from both sides of road closure.

From your Mayor

"There go my people, I must find out where they are going so I can lead them."

We chuckle at this quote by 18th century French politician Alexandre Auguste Ledru-Rollin, but oddly that's the idea behind our town's approach to governing. If you are a regular reader of this column – and I hope at least a few of you are – you know the importance we place on our many town boards and committees and how the volunteers on those committees help shape Lewisville's policies.

As a council we are, in fact, listening to our residents. Trying to understand what priorities we should be setting. Where we should be investing public funds. And where we need to lead.

I've also written quite a bit about our sense of community and the importance of public places where all of us can gather to meet and share in those things that make Lewisville so special. Our plays, concerts, events, parades, Shallowford Square, Jack Warren Park, our schools and library. They all contribute to our sense of community or what I call "community building."

Here's how the two ideas are connected.

This year we are going to take another step in community building as we begin planning for a new community center. Our planning board; parks, recreation and cultural development committee and the town council have provided initial direction for this project. But now is when you come in.

Over the next month, we will be forming a volunteer resident advisory group to provide thoughts on this project and share what might be included in our community center planning. What types of functional facilities should we include? What programs or other activities should we consider?

Our first goal is to determine the needs and wants of our community and then lead the process as we move to the design phase. If you studied architecture, you are familiar with the phrase "form follows function." That's our approach. Let's determine what our community center should be and then design and locate the facility accordingly.

Related to our ability to move forward with your community center is a meeting that your Town Council and staff had in late January. At that meeting, we developed our town's capital improvement and infrastructure plan that will guide our anticipated investment of more than \$6.7 million in brick and mortar projects that will occur over the next seven years including our community center, storm water management, roadway improvements, sidewalks, street lights and parks and recreation enhancements.

The good news is we have been saving for many of these projects over the years in our capital reserve accounts. This means we are projected to continue to have a healthy balance in our general fund while we carry out this improvement plan.

I am very excited that we are embarking on a number of projects that will make Lewisville an even better place to live for you and your family, while we continue to maintain the prudent fiscal management of your tax dollars.

It's my privilege to serve you each day as your mayor and, as always, I welcome your comments.

DO YOU KNOW WHAT THE TOWNWIDE SPEED LIMIT IS?

If you said 25 MPH you are right. (Unless otherwise posted) Speed limit is the maximum speed at which a vehicle is legally permitted to travel, as within a specific area, on a certain road, or under given conditions. Be alert that other roads in town may have lower posted speed limits. An example of this is Lucy Lane which goes in front of Lewisville Elementary School. It has a posted speed limit at 10 mph.

Fun Fact: On May 21, 1901 Connecticut became the first state to pass a law regulating motor vehicles, limiting their speed to 12 mph in cities and 15 mph on country roads.

WHO MAINTAINS THE ROADS

Here in Lewisville we have both town and state maintained roads. Knowing whether a road is owned and maintained by the State or the Town can be confusing. Road Maintenance on the Town Public roads in Lewisville are maintained by two entities - the Town of Lewisville and the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT).

Driving to and from Winston-Salem via Business 40 will impact your traveling over the next few years. The N.C. Department of Transportation is beginning the project development to completely upgrade and streamline a one-mile section of U.S. 421/Business 40 from west of Fourth Street to east of Church Street in Winston-Salem. The project will include removing the existing pavement and replacing it with new concrete pavement. The project will also modernize the entrance and exit ramps, and replace most of the bridges on and over Business 40 with new bridges that meet current traffic demands and modern design specifications. The project will create a safer, longer lasting roadway that will help drivers get where they need to go more efficiently.

SPECIAL RECYCLING EVENT

A special recycle collection event has been planned for Saturday, April 28th from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. at Shallowford Square. This event is for items that are not accepted in the regular recycle collection. "This event offers the Town residents a proper way to recycle items that are not permitted in the regular curbside recycle collection", said George Stilphen, Chair of the Recycling Committee. "People often call Town Hall inquiring about recycle procedures for Styrofoam peanuts and bubble wrap as well as other items that are not accepted curbside.

RECYCLING ITEMS ACCEPTED WILL INCLUDE:

Plastic and paper grocery bags, Styrofoam peanuts and bubble wrap, Styrofoam egg cartons, inkjet and laser cartridges, cell phones, plastic 6 pack rings, household batteries (only NiCad, mercury, lead and lithium), residential fluorescent bulbs, empty propane tanks, corks, #1 non-small neck plastic containers like cool whip tubs and lids, #5 plastic food containers (like yogurt), and automobile batteries.

ITEMS <u>UNACCEPTABLE</u> WILL INCLUDE:

No items that are already permitted in the curbside recycling program such as cardboard and newspaper, no used motor oil, latex paint or antifreeze. All chemicals, paints, televisions and hazardous waste must be taken to the 3RC Envirostation in Winston-Salem. No glass or other plastics not accepted curbside, no toys, housewares or small appliances.

Clean used toys, housewares and other small working appliances should be taken to the Goodwill site at the Oaks Shopping Center.


